

2019 Car Seat Check-up Events

Want to learn how to install your child's car seat safely? Want to know when your child is ready to move on to the next seat or graduate from their booster seat? Trained technicians can teach you and guide you with good information.

Child passenger safety technicians will check your child's seat for:

- Correct installation
- Recalls and damage
- Best fit for weight, height and age

All Car Seat Check-up Events are held on Saturdays, from 11-2. 11-12:30p.m. by appointment only 12:30-2 p.m. drop in- first come, first serve

Car Seat Assistance Program

We may be able to help you purchase a low cost car seat thanks to community partnerships with several agencies.

Important! You need to come to the Community Health Education Center 939 Oak St. SE, Bldg. D, 1st floor Mondays - Fridays, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Eligibility: To be eligible, the child, the parent or guardian needs to show proof of current identification cards for WIC or OHP.

At the car seat check-up event, the technicians will confirm that there is a need for a new car seat.

Co-Pay: A \$30 cash co-pay per seat or \$10 per booster seat must be paid in advance at the Community Health Education Center (CHEC) in order to reserve a seat. You will be given a receipt to bring to the next car seat check-up event to obtain the seat.

Availability: Seats are available, by appointment, and given out only during the car seat check-up events. These are held on Saturdays as listed on the calendar on the other side of this flyer.

This service is brought to you in partnership with Salem Health, Salem Health Foundation, Keizer Fire Dept., Polk County Fire Dept., the Oregon Dept. of Transportation, and Oregon Impact.

Other program information:

 Seats are only provided to parents or legal guardians, who must be present to obtain the seat.

Only one seat per child.

- The child receiving the seat must be present unless the baby is not yet born.
- The vehicle in which the child travels must be brought to the car seat check.
- Parents or guardians will be taught to correctly install and use the car seat.
