



Background



- Pressure ulcers become a priority
 - Joint Commission National Patient Safety Goals (2003)
 - Change to CMS guidelines (2008)
 - •\$\$\$
- Salem Hospital HAPU
 - •2004-2006 > 4% drop in HAPU with initiation of NDNQI surveys
 - •2006-2007 our facility experienced a persistent HAPU rate of 6%






Our Outcomes
