I heard about Ken long before I met him... I've been at SH for 6 years. I worked NOC shift my first couple of years so don't remember much, but I do remember this is when I first heard about Ken. Patients whom I cared for mentioned a great nurse named Ken on IMCU. They spoke about his kindness and compassion. I heard stories about his singing. I continued to hear even more stories about Ken when I moved to dayshift. Many patients and family members talked about Ken spending his breaks with them. I was told by a couple different family members that they felt their family member was safe and would be well cared for when they saw Ken.

Last fall, a patient was admitted to the hospital and soon thereafter were planning to remove life support. This patient had been in and out of the hospital for over a year and each time the patient was admitted to our floor, the family talked about Ken and how great he was, how he'd taken such great care of the patient. At the end, the family requested that Ken be notified so he could stop by to see them.

I last saw Ken a couple of weeks ago when he floated to our unit. He came to me in the afternoon to talk with me about a patient who he was worried about. He wanted someone else to know because he'd tried to help and didn't feel like he was getting through. I remember thinking that Ken was one person I KNEW would make the best effort to help.
